

## ORDINANCE NO. 35

AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE GRADING AND PAVING OF JAMISON LANE IN MONROEVILLE BOROUGH, FOR A WIDTH OF 24 FEET, EXTENDING FROM THE INTERSECTION OF SAID JAMISON LANE AND THE TURTLE CREEK-MONROEVILLE ROAD, SOUTH  $38^{\circ} 21' 40''$  EAST, A DISTANCE OF 1083.80 FEET, INCLUDING NECESSARY DRAINAGE FACILITIES AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE COSTS AND EXPENSES THEREFOR.

The Council of the Borough of Monroeville in the County of Allegheny and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania does hereby ordain and enact the following ordinance:

SECTION 1. Jamison Lane in said Borough, extending from the intersection of said Jamison Lane and the Turtle Creek-Monroeville Road, South  $38^{\circ} 21' 40''$  East, a distance of 1083.80 feet, and at a uniform width of 24 feet throughout, 12 feet on each side of the center line of said street, is hereby directed to be graded and paved, to consist of base course of 8 inches of No. 4 crushed stone or slag rolled and a top course of 2 inches of bituminous surface, together with drainage facilities and to be at the grade established by Ordinance No. 34 of said Borough, enacted May 3, 1954, in accordance with said Borough's Jamison Lane Paving and drainage Plan, dated March 11, 1954, revised June 23, 1954, prepared by Thompson Survey Service and marked Plan No. E-262A, on file in the office of the Borough Secretary of Monroeville Borough.

SECTION 2. That said work shall be performed by the lowest most responsible bidder to whom the contract for said work shall be awarded by the Council of said Borough, and the advertising for bids for the construction of said work as hereinabove described is hereby authorized.

SECTION 3. Any trees, pipes, or other materials interfering with the free and full construction of said work, excepting presently existing utility lines, are hereby declared to be nuisances and may be removed or changed by or under the direction of the Borough Engineer, who is hereby designated as the person in charge of said work, with full power to act for said Borough in all things connected with said work and the contracts thereunder.

SECTION 4. The costs and expenses of the entire construction shall be paid upon completion by the Borough of Monroeville and the owners of real estate

bounding or abutting on said street, in accordance with written petition dated June 30, 1954, by a majority of the said owners in number and in front foot-frontage, accepted and approved by said Borough on July 9, 1954, as follows:

Amount to be paid by the Borough	\$ 6,000.00
Amount to be paid by the property owners, excluding United States Steel Corporation, on the front-foot basis	\$ 2,400.00
Amount to be paid by United States Steel Corporation on the front-foot basis	\$ 787.23
Additional amount to be paid by the United States Steel Corporation	Balance of Costs

SECTION 5. The amount to be paid by the Borough is hereby appropriated therefor out of funds now or hereafter in the Borough treasury, and the amount to be paid by the owners of real estate bounding or abutting on said street is hereby assessed and the assessments appropriated therefor.

SECTION 6. All Ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed insofar as the same are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.
