

ORDINANCE NO. 408

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONROEVILLE, ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA ACCEPTING THE BID OF CONSTANTIN MOTORS FOR THE LEASING OF POLICE MOTOR VEHICLES TO THE BOROUGH AND AWARDING A CONTRACT FOR THE SAME TO THE SAID CONSTANTIN MOTORS.

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Monroeville, heretofore advertised for bids, for the leasing of Motor Vehicles for use by the Police Department of the Borough, in accordance with law; and

WHEREAS, Constantin Motors was found to be the lowest responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, the Borough presently has a contract with Dix Cadillac-Pontiac Company of State College, Pennsylvania for leasing of Motor Vehicles for use by the Police Department of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough desires to accept the bid and award the contract to Constantin Motors; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Monroeville desires to cancel the contract with Dix Cadillac-Pontiac Company.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Monroeville and it is hereby ordained by the Authority of the same:

SECTION 1: The bid of Constantin Motors to supply by lease Pontiac Sedan Automobiles at \$225.00 per month and Pontiac Station Wagons at \$240.00 per month for use of the Police Department of the Borough of Monroeville is hereby accepted.

SECTION 2: The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Constantin Motors in accordance with said bid.

SECTION 3: The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby directed to cancel the contract heretofore made with Dix Cadillac-Pontiac Company.

SECTION 4: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
