

## ORDINANCE NO. 740

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONROEVILLE AUTHORIZING THE REPAVING OF CERTAIN STREETS, MISCELLANEOUS PAVING, THE PURCHASE OF STREET TRAFFIC PAINT AND TRAFFIC BEADS, THE PURCHASE OF SANITARY SEWER PIPE, AND THE DEMOLITION OF CONDEMNED STRUCTURES.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Borough of Monroeville, in Council assembled, as follows:

Section 1. That portions of the following streets: West Patty Lane, Maria Lane, Bert Drive, Caruso Drive, Carson Street, Virgin Street, Glencrest Drive, Huntington Drive, Park Place, Center Road, Old William Penn Highway, Shackelford Drive, and Scott Drive, be repaved, using state road funds; and that such repaving contract be awarded to Burrell Construction and Supply Company, Inc., which upon the opening of bids was the lowest responsible bidder therefor, whose total bid, based upon the plans and specifications for such repaving as advertised, was Thirty-four Thousand Five Hundred Ten (\$34,510.00) Dollars. The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Burrell Construction and Supply Company, Inc., for the repaving of portions of the said streets for the said sum of Thirty-four Thousand Five Hundred Ten and 00/100 (\$34,510.00) Dollars. Upon the execution of the said contract, said contractor shall file with the Monroeville Borough Manager a performance bond, labor and materialmen's bond, maintenance bond and certificates of insurance, as required in said contract.

Section 2. That miscellaneous paving as specified in the advertisement for bids be performed by Burrell Construction and Supply Company, Inc., for a total cost of Thirteen Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-five and 00/100 (\$13,265.00) Dollars, the said contractor being the lowest responsible bidder for such paving services. The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Burrell Construction and Supply Company, Inc., for the miscellaneous paving above specified for the said sum of Thirteen Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-five and 00/100 (\$13,265.00) Dollars. Upon the execution of the said contract the said contractor shall file with the Monroeville Borough Manager a performance bond, labor and materialmen's bond, maintenance bond and certificates of insurance, as required in said contract.

Section 3. That street traffic paint be purchased under a contract with Prismo Universal Corporation, who was the lowest responsible bidder for white traffic paint at One and 92/100 (\$1.92) Dollars per gallon, with Alternate No. 1 at the same price; and for yellow traffic paint at One and 93/100 (\$1.93) Dollars per gallon, with Alternate No. 1 at the same price. The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Prismo Universal Corporation for the purchase of said street traffic paint at the prices per gallon above specified. Upon the execution of the said contract the said contractor shall file with the Monroeville Borough Manager such performance bonds as may be required in the contract.

Section 4. That traffic beads be purchased from Flex-O-Lite Division of General Steel Industries at a price of \$.1469 per pound, which was the lowest responsible bid. The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby

authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Flex-O-Lite Division of General Steel Industries for the purchase of traffic beads at a price of \$.1469 per pound. Upon the execution of the said contract the said contractor shall file with the Monroeville Borough Manager such performance bond as required by the contract.

Section 5. That sanitary sewer pipe be purchased from the Flintkote Company at a price of One Thousand Seven Hundred Ten and 00/100 (\$1,710.00) Dollars for fifteen hundred (1500) feet of eight-inch Class 2400 pipe; One Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy-five and 00/100 (\$1,875.00) Dollars for fifteen hundred (1500) feet of eight-inch Class 3300 pipe; and Nine Hundred Twenty and 00/100 (\$920.00) Dollars for one thousand (1,000) feet of six-inch Class 2400 pipe, which was the lowest responsible bid for the quantities advertised. The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Flintkote Company for the purchase of the said sanitary sewer pipe at the prices above stated. Upon the execution of the said contract, said contractor shall file with the Monroeville Borough Manager such performance bond as may be required by the contract.

Section 6. That the following condemned structures be demolished:

(A) A former two-car residential garage located at 4366 Old William Penn Highway;

(B) Two frame cottages on the east side of Route 286 north of Beryl Chevrolet;

(C) The former residential two-story frame structure located at 3975 Northern Pike; and

(D) A vacant commercial structure being a concrete block shell located behind Valley Buick off Haymaker Road.

Item (A) shall be demolished by J. W. Harper, whose low bid was One (\$1.00) Dollar; Item (B) shall be demolished by Bishop Asphalt Paving, Inc., whose low bid was Three Hundred and 00/100 (\$300.00) Dollars; Item (C) shall be demolished by Bishop Asphalt Paving, Inc., whose low bid was Six Hundred Fifty and 00/100 (\$650.00) Dollars; and Item (D) shall be demolished by Bishop Asphalt Paving, Inc., whose low bid was Two Hundred Fifty and 00/100 (\$250.00) Dollars. The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby authorized and directed to enter into contracts with J. W. Harper and Bishop Asphalt, Inc., for the demolition of the above stated structures at the prices stated. Upon the execution of the said contracts, the contractors shall file with the Monroeville Borough Manager performance bonds, labor and materialmen's bond and certificates of insurance as may be required by the said contracts.
