

ORDINANCE NO. 828

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONROEVILLE AUTHORIZING
AND DIRECTING THE CONSTRUCTION OF MOSSIDE SANITARY
SEWER, MCKENZIE ROAD SANITARY SEWER, MELLON PLAN STORM
SEWER, AND GARDEN CITY DRIVE STORM SEWER; AND PROVIDING
FOR THE EXECUTION OF CONTRACTS

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Borough of Monroeville, in Council assembled,
as follows:

Section 1. That sanitary sewer lines be constructed to serve areas of Mosside Boulevard and McKenzie Road in accordance with plans and specifications therefore known as Mosside Sanitary Sewer Contract No. 7301-S and McKenzie Road Sanitary Sewer Contract No. 7302-S; and that storm sewers be constructed for an area of Mellon Plan and of Garden City Drive in accordance with plans and specifications therefore known as Mellon Plan Storm Sewer Contract No. 73-SS-1 and Garden City Drive Storm Sewer Contract No. 73-SS-2.

Section 2. Upon the opening of bids for the construction of Mosside Sanitary Sewer Contract No. 7301-S, it appeared that the lowest responsible bidder therefore was Al Monzo Construction Company, Inc., whose total bid based on quantities contained in said contract was Sixteen Thousand, Eight Hundred and Ninety (\$16,890.00) Dollars. Upon the opening of bids for the building of McKenzie Road Sanitary Sewer Contract No. 7302-S, it appeared that the lowest responsible bidder therefore was Ralph Rizzi, Inc., whose total bid based on quantities contained in said contract was Forty Three Thousand, Seven Hundred and Sixty One (\$43,761.00) Dollars. Upon the opening of the bids for the construction of the Mellon Plan Storm Sewer Contract No. 73-SS-1, it appeared that the lowest responsible bidder therefore was Patsy Frolo, whose total bid based on quantities contained in said contract was Twenty Six Thousand and Seventy Eight (\$26,078.00) Dollars. Upon the opening of the bids for the construction of the Garden City Drive Storm Sewer Contract No. 73-SS-2, it appeared that the lowest responsible bidder therefore was Claus, Inc., whose total bid based on quantities contained in said contract was Fourteen Thousand Eighty Two (\$14,082.00) Dollars.

Section 3. The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Al Monzo Construction Company, Inc., for the construction of said Contract No. 7301-S for the said sum of Sixteen Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety (\$16,890.00) Dollars; and are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Ralph Rizzi, Inc., for the construction of said Contract No. 7302-S for the said sum of Forty Three Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty One (\$43,761.00) Dollars, subject to a permit being issued by the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission to drill under the turnpike; and are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Patsy Frolo for the construction of said Contract No. 73-SS-1 for the said sum of Twenty Six Thousand Seventy Eight (\$26,078.00) Dollars; and are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Claus, Inc., for the construction of said Contract No. 73-SS-2 for the said sum of Fourteen Thousand, Eighty Two (\$14,082.00) Dollars. Upon the execution of the said contracts, the contractors shall file with the Monroeville Borough Manager performance bonds, labor and materialmen's bonds, maintenance bonds and certificates of insurance, as required in the said contracts.
