ORDINANCE NO. 1611

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF  
MONROEVILLE, ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA,  
PROHIBITING STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING  
AT ANY AND ALL TIMES ON THOMAS STREET IN THE  
FIRST WARD OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF MONROEVILLE;  
AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF  
THIS ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the Municipality has the authority to prohibit  
stopping, standing or parking under 75 Pa. C.S.A. §6109 (a)(1);  
and

WHEREAS, the Municipality is desirous of securing the  
health and safety of its citizens by eliminating unsafe traffic  
conditions; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the regulation of  
traffic on Thomas Street, in the First Ward, is being impeded by  
the stopping, standing and parking of vehicles on that street.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the  
Council of the Municipality of Monroeville, and it is hereby  
ordained and enacted by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1.      Definitions.

The following words and phrases when used in this title shall have, unless the content clearly indicates otherwise, the following meanings:

1.) "Park" or "Parking." The halting of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading property or passengers.

2.) "Stand" or "Standing." The halting of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers.

3.) "Stop" or "Stopping." Any halting, even momentarily, of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic-control sign or signal.

SECTION 2.      Prohibition.

The stopping, standing or parking of any vehicles is hereby prohibited at any and all times on Thomas Street, in the First Ward, in the Municipality of Monroeville.

SECTION 3.      Notice of Violation.

Whenever any police officer of the Municipality of Monroeville shall see any vehicle parked in violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of the Pennsylvania Motor

Vehicle Code, he may place a tag or violation notice upon such vehicle or hand the same to the operator thereof. Such tag shall indicate the license number of the vehicle, the date, time, and nature of the violation, and the penalty therefor, and shall contain a notice that unless the violator shall within seventy-two (72) hours of such violation pay to the Municipality, for the use of the Municipality, the sum of \$ 25.00 which is received by the Municipality within that time, he shall pay the full fine. Otherwise, upon his admission of such violation, or his conviction before a District Justice he shall be subject to the penalties hereinafter provided for violation.

SECTION 4. Penalty for Violation.

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$ 50.00 or more than \$ 100.00 and costs of prosecution.

SECTION 5. Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional or illegal, such decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as a legislative intent that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional or illegal provisions not been included herein.

SECTION 6. Any Ordinance or part of an Ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed so far as the same affects this Ordinance.
