ORDINANCE NO. 1719

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF MONROEVILLE,
ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING SECTION
4 OF ORDINANCE NO. 695 PROHIBITING THE USE OF
GLASS CONTAINERS IN PARK AND CONSERVATION AREAS;
PROHIBITING THE CREATION OF OFFENSIVE ODORS,
EXCESSIVE NOISE OR UNSANITARY CONDITIONS BY
OWNERS OF DOMESTICATED ANIMALS.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the
Municipality of Monroeville and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the
authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 4 of Ordinance No. 695 is hereby amended to read
as follows:

Section 4. ACTS PROHIBITED.

(b) Animals. It shall be unlawful for owners of
domesticated animals to permit the same within recreation, park or
conservation areas without being controlled by a leash not more than six (6)
feet long. Permits may be obtained for the training and/or exhibition of
animals in designated areas. It shall be unlawful to bring any dangerous
animal into any recreation, park or conservation area.

It shall be unlawful for owners of domesticated animals to create
offensive odors, excessive noise or unsanitary conditions which are a menace
to the health, comfort or safety of the public by permitting any dog, cat or
other domesticated animal to scratch, dig or defecate upon any grass, tree,
shrub, plant, building or any other public property within the recreation,
park or conservation area.

SECTION 2. Section 4 of Ordinance No. 695 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 4. ACTS PROHIBITED.

(g) It shall be unlawful for any person to bring into a recreation, park or conservation area any glass container to be used for consumption of any beverage or other product in said recreation, park or conservation area.

SECTION 3. Any Ordinance or Resolution or part of an Ordinance or Resolution in conflict herewith is hereby repealed.
