ORDINANCE NO. 1726

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF MONROEVILLE
AUTHORIZING THE PROPER OFFICIALS OF MONROEVILLE
TO ENTER INTO AN AMENDMENT TO THE COLLECTIVE
BARGAINING AGREEMENT WITH THE MONROEVILLE POLICE
OFFICERS.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Municipality of Monroeville, in
Council assembled as follows:

SECTION 1. The proper officials of the Municipality of Monroeville
are hereby authorized to enter into an amendment to the Collective
Bargaining Agreement with the Monroeville Police Department.


SECTION 2. A copy of said amendment to the Collective Bargaining
Agreement is attached hereto, made a part hereof and marked Exhibit "A".

SECTION 3. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with
this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

AMENDMENT TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE MUNICIPALITY OF MONROEVILLE AND THE
MONROEVILLE POLICE BARGAINING UNIT

Following negotiations between the parties, the Municipality of Monroeville and the Monroeville Police Bargaining Unit agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. Disability Pension Benefit - The Municipality of Monroeville will provide a disability pension benefit as set forth in the attached Ordinance amending the Monroeville Police Pension Plan.

2. Any police officer who is granted a disability retirement shall receive the same fringe benefits given to police officers upon normal retirement, if the disability is job related. However, if the disability is not job related, a police officer who receives a disability retirement shall not receive any of such benefits unless he or she has 15 years of service as a police officer for the Municipality.

3. Each party agrees to waive its rights to re-open the contract, as set forth in Section 1 of Ordinance 1679, concerning any issues for contract years 1991 and 1992.

4. The remainder of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the Municipality of Monroeville and the Monroeville Police Bargaining Unit shall remain in full force and effect, except as expressly amended by this agreement.

5. The parties have executed this agreement, as of the 13 day of November, 1990, upon ratification and approval by the Municipality of Monroeville and the Police Bargaining Unit membership, intending to be legally bound hereby.
