**ORDINANCE NO. 2426**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF MONROEVILLE, ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, A HOME RULE CHARTER COMMUNITY, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2377 TO PROVIDE FOR CERTAIN BUDGET REDUCTION MEASURES ASSOCIATED WITH THE MUNICIPALITY OF MONROEVILLE/MONROEVILLE VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANIES AGREEMENT DATED SEPTEMBER 12, 2006 AND ITS EXHIBIT "A", ENTITLED SCHEDULE OF APPARATUS REPLACEMENT**

**WHEREAS**, the MONROEVILLE FIRE CHIEFS COMMITTEE (MFCC) has agreed to amend Exhibit "A" to the Agreement dated September 26, 2006 to eliminate the replacement of VFC #5 Engine/Pumper 52, provided a commitment from the Municipality of Monroeville is made to VFC #5 of \$150,000.00 for a subsidy to replace VFC #5 Tanker Truck in 2018 or similar agreed upon fire apparatus; and

**WHEREAS**, a Revised Exhibit "A" is created to reflect those changes and attached hereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the changes will greatly assist in Monroeville's 2009 budget planning.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED** as follows:

**SECTION I:** The current fire services Agreement between the Municipality of Monroeville and the MFCC is amended to eliminate the purchase of Engine/Pumper 52 due in 2012, and a commitment of \$150,000.00 by the Municipality of Monroeville is made as part of the amended Agreement to be used exclusively for the Tanker Truck purchase in 2018 or similar agreed upon fire apparatus for VFC #5.

**SECTION II:** The MFCC agrees to sell Engine/Pumper 52 now and the Municipality of Monroeville agrees to use the proceeds of that sale and place in an interest bearing restricted account for the \$150,000.00 future commitment to subsidize the replacement of VFC #5's Tanker Truck, or similar agreed upon fire apparatus.


**SECTION III:** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. The following Ordinance or parts thereof are specifically repealed; and

**SECTION IV:** If any sentence, clause, section, or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality, or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Municipality that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.
